*Per year for 2 years for the Masters degree and per year for 3 years for the Doctoral degree. Part of the fee is payable in Euros and part in RMB (Chinese Yuan).

NOTES:

The part-time study option is available to home/EU students.

The full-time study option is the only option available to International/Overseas students.

Home/EU students studying on a part-time basis may be able to avail of any additional taught modules or tutorial support run by ICTCM as part of the full-time Masters or Doctoral Programme, without incurring additional tuition fees.

Students wishing to conduct their research in Guangzhou, China may make use of the University's facilities without having to pay any additional tuition fee to GUCM.

Other Expenses

In addition to the fees set out above, students will be responsible for their own living expenses, accommodation, food, travel and all other expenses while in China or Ireland including, as required, travel to and from GUCM China and ICTCM, Ireland.

Text-books, research materials and all study aids are at the students own expense, as is the cost of preparation and translation of the thesis into both English and Chinese. Students will also be responsible for the cost (if any) of on-going communication with their Supervisor/s in Guangzhou or Dublin.

In order to make the programme as cost-effective as possible for Home/EU students studying on a part-time basis, it is expected that the taught modules for both the Masters Degree and the Doctoral Degree will take place as follows:

1. During the initial visit to Guangzhou when students must attend GUCM to officially register with the Chinese Government's Department of Education, 2 or 3 taught modules will be completed.
2. During the first year of each programme the remaining taught modules will take place in ICTCM, Dublin, Ireland. These will be run in one-week-long intensive blocks, distributed throughout the year, thus minimising disruption to Clinical practice and/or other full-time work.

This schema will also minimise the travel expenses between the student's home country and China or Ireland.

Subject to the approval of GUCM, part-time students should be able to conduct most of their research and thesis writing in their home country where this is viable and should they wish to do so.

Additional Notes

- All fees are non-refundable.
- Any student who fails to pay the requisite fees in full by the required date will be deemed to be in breach of the acceptance conditions and will no longer be regarded as a student by either College/University.
- The fee payment schedule must be strictly adhered to.
- No part-payment or payment in instalments will be allowed.
